The Panchatantra is written in the Sanskrit language and its authorship is attributed to Vishnu Sharma. Panchatantra is an ancient Indian collection of interrelated animal fables. Panchatantra came from two words—Pancha (Five) and Tantra (Chapters). It is believed that Panchatantra was composed to teach the general conduct to the three sons of King Amara-shakti. The stories of Panchatantra are divided into five parts. They are—(i) Mitra Labha [ Gaining Friends ], (ii) Mitra Bheda [ Dissonance among Friends ], (iii) Labdhapranasam [ Loss of what was attained ], Apariksitakarakam [ Acting without thinking ] and (v) Kakolukiya [ The story of Crows and Owls ].

Panchatantra is translated into many languages that include Persian, Telugu, Hindi, Arabic, English and many more. In India, Panchatantra is also known as 'Nitishastra'. It means 'the wise conduct of life'.
